Doctor duo pinpoints eye fungus vector

One day in 2006, Dr. John D. Bullock, a well-known ophthalmologist and longtime Oakwood resident, now retired from practice but teaching infectious disease epidemiology at Wright State's public health program, stopped in for one of his visits to Dr. Ronald Warwar, the ophthalmologist who had taken over

Bullock's practice in 2002. During the visit, Warwar reported that, in one week, he had diagnosed two of his patients with a fungal corneal ulcer, also known as fungal keratitis, an extremely rare disease that causes permanent eye damage and in some cases blindness. The disease is so rare, in fact, that Bullock, in his 25 years of practice, had seen only one case. The probability of two cases in

one week would be virtually zero. For Bullock this presented a call to action; the cause of the disease outbreak had to be found. Warwar agreed, and both began what would be a three-year effort to pinpoint the culprit cause.

Turning to the Internet, Bullock and Warwar discovered 40 cases to have been reported, not in the United
