"We have 315 employees maintaining and managing our Parks...it costs the taxpayers less than one dollar per month." It is a ten year 1.8 percent levy.

Howard Blose, Class of '40 lettered in football, track, and basketball. Sr, Class Pres. & Valedictorian. At Cornell he held the school's scoring record for 20 years. Awarded Bronze star for the battle of Okinawa. V-P of Exxon Corp. Jim Whalen was the presenter.

Dr. Tim Coughlin, Class of '64 was a three year starter in football. Named Dayton Daily News 'Area's most valuable player', All Conference. Also received letters in basketball and track. Tim lives in Reno. Nev. His brother, Jim Coughlin and wife Amy were with him. Bill **Pees** was Dr. Tim's presenter.

Howard Sales, Coach of OHS, was an honoree. **Dan Rasor** was his presenter. Howard was Coach/Athletic Director from '65 to '95. He taught history, social studies and Phys. Ed. As head football coach he had 112 wins - the most of any coach in OHS history. Pres. of Ohio High School Football Coaches Assoc and elected to their Hall of Fame.

Katy Deddens Dalrymple, Class of '93, was presented by Lisa Fickert. "Katy was a four year Field Hockey starter. Her junior year she set the scoring
