Jacks soccer loses to Bellbrook, skunks Franklin

On Sept. 29, the Oakwood High School Boys' Soccer team met up with arch-rival Bellbrook at Mack Hummon Stadium. Although Oakwood had a much better showing in this re-match, the Eagles survived a second half dominated by the Jacks to salvage a 1-0 victory. Bellbrook scored its only goal about half way through the first half. The rest of the first half was a stalemate.

The tide turned in the second

half, and the Jacks had Bellbrook on its heels for most of the half. Sophomores Alex Gardner, Andrew Dickerson, and Max Snyder all had good looks at the goal, with Gardner and Snyder's shots sailing just high, while the Bellbrook goalkeeper made a great save to fend off Dickerson's attempt. Another Sophomore, Zach Harmony, anchored the defense with Seniors, Tim Fecher and Tyler Henry Payne, limiting the Eagles attack the entire sec-

ond half.

Scott Harman had another great game in goal for the Jacks, and with four seconds left, after being pulled from the goal, Harman headed a throw-in from Harrison Davis that was just cut-off by a diving save from the Bellbrook goalkeeper to preserve the 1-0 victory.

Oakwood carried over its great play from the second half of the Bellbrook game into their Oct. 1 home match against Franklin,

coming away with an 8-0 victory.

The scoring began only six minutes into the game with a header from senior Anthony Weckerling, off of a free kick from Fecher. Senior mid-fielder David Shephard fired in the second goal less than ten minutes later. Weckerling scored again goal with about 20 minutes left in the half, and then, senior Graham Roberts, capitalized on a corner kick feed from senior Marcel Georgin, who controlled the mid-

dle of the field most of the game with Gardner.

In the second half, the scoring continued, with Roberts scoring two more times, and Harman picking up two goals of his own after being replaced in goal by junior Ryan McFarland just before half-time.

The Jacks go on the road on Oct. 6 and 8 to face Valley View and Eaton before returning home on Oct. 13 to host Brookville on Parents' Night.
